Ephesians 6:1-9^{ESV}

¹ Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. ² “Honor your father and mother” (this is the first commandment with a promise), ³ “that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land.”

Ephesians 6:1-9^{ESV}

⁴ Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.

Ephesians 6:1-9^{ESV}

⁵ Bondservants, obey your earthly masters with fear and trembling, with a sincere heart, as you would Christ, ⁶ not by the way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart,

Ephesians 6:1-9^{ESV}

⁷ rendering service with a good will as to the Lord, and not to man, ⁸ knowing that whatever good anyone does, this he will receive back from the Lord, - whether he is a bondservant or is free.

Ephesians 6:9^{ESV}

⁹ Masters, (ΚΥΡΙΟΣ) do the same to them, and stop your threatening, knowing that he who is both their Master (ΚΥΡΙΟΣ) and yours is in heaven, and that there is no partiality with him.

Ephesians 6:8^{ESV}

Knowing that whatever good anyone does, this he will receive back from the Lord, whether he is a bondservant or is free.

Ephesians 6:9^{ESV}

⁹ Masters, (ΚΥΡΙΟΣ) do the same to them, and stop your threatening, knowing that he who is both their Master (ΚΥΡΙΟΣ) and yours is in heaven, and that there is no partiality with him.

Genesis 16:1-16^{ESV}

Sarai and Hagar

Now Sarai, Abram's wife, had borne him no children. She had a female Egyptian servant whose name was Hagar. ² And Sarai said to Abram,

“Behold now, the LORD has prevented me from bearing children. Go in to my servant; it may be that I shall obtain children by her.” And Abram listened to the voice of Sarai.

Genesis 16:1-16^{ESV}

³ So, after Abram had lived ten years in the land of Canaan, Sarai, Abram's wife, took Hagar the Egyptian, her servant, and gave her to Abram her husband as a wife. ⁴ And he went in

to Hagar, and she conceived. And when she saw that she had conceived, she looked with contempt on her mistress. ⁵ And Sarai said to Abram, “May the wrong done to me

be on you! I gave my servant to your embrace, and when she saw that she had conceived, she looked on me with contempt. May the LORD judge between you and me!”⁶ But Abram

said to Sarai, “Behold, your servant is in your power; do to her as you please.” Then Sarai dealt harshly with her, and she fled from her.⁷ The angel of the LORD found her by a

spring of water in the wilderness, the spring on the way to Shur.⁸ And he said, “Hagar, servant of Sarai, where have you come from and where are you going?” She said, “I am fleeing

from my mistress Sarai.”⁹ The angel of the LORD said to her, “Return to your mistress and submit to her.”
